The Twin Towers: Teen Pregnancy and Abortion

Julie's boyfriend became irresponsible and left Julie with their child. They have not talked to each other since that day. Julie now was stuck with the fact that she has to finish high school, go to college, and get a good job to support her baby. Now do you think that would be easy for Julie to accomplish? I personally do not think so. Julie has regretted the fact that she rejected what her parents had taught her and has vowed to teach her child that what she did was wrong. Now, Julie has learned her lesson the hard way. However, we must immediately emphasize to teens the rigors of teen pregnancy before they go through what Julie was going through. Therefore, I believe that teen pregnancy is totally wrong and that teens should try their absolute best to practice sexual abstinence, otherwise their life would be a living nightmare.

First of all, let us consider the vast responsibilities of being a teen parent. Now, when teens think they are ready for a baby or want to have sex, they forget the great responsibilities presented to them when they have this baby. The most obvious responsibility is supporting the baby, which encompasses many things. First of all, you have to have some source of income or basically get a job in order to buy food, baby supplies such as diapers and cradles, and pay for bills. Not only that, but you must attend school as well. If you do not finish at least your high school education, getting a job will be almost impossible. So imagine having to go to school and go to work at the same time. That will be an extremely rough day for a teenage girl or boy. Unfortunately though, the responsibilities do not stop there. You also have to actually take care of the baby. When it cries at night, no matter our tired you are, you have to wake up and caress it until it stops. In addition, you have to change the baby's diapers when they, in proper terms, secrete waste. You also have to feed your baby when they are hungry and bring them to the doctor when they need health shots and when they are sick. Therefore, the responsibilities of a teen parent are obviously immense compared to regular teen attends school. I wonder how many hours of sleep teen parents are able to achieve every night because of their busy schedule. I advise that teens should consider their responsibilities of a teen parent before even thinking about having sex.

Secondly, the disadvantages of being a teen parent are numerous. The odds of having a successful life when being a teen parent are totally against you. The first disadvantage of being a teen parent is that you have no social life. Therefore, relationships will fall apart and will be left alone with nobody to care for you. Almost fifty to sixty percent of teen pregnancies result in the departure of one of the parents. Therefore, many single mothers and single fathers have a tough time raising their child all alone. Thirdly, teen parents have to put their baby as their main

priority. However, how can they concentrate on their school work if you have a baby that is under the care of a babysitter? My mother said that when she left me at daycare for the first time, she could not even concentrate on her work; her mind was totally on how I was doing. It is the same exact situation with a teen parent. A teen parent cannot take an Algebra test when his or her child is under the care of another person. That is why according to National Teen Prevention Campaign that "Teen mothers are less likely to complete high school (only one-third receive a high school diploma) and only 1.5% have a college degree by age 30. Teen mothers are more likely to end up on welfare (nearly 80 percent of unmarried teen mothers end up on welfare)". The fourth disadvantage of being a teen parent is one of the most damaging of them all. Your future is altered. Many teen parents probably had high ambitions to go to a good college, marry, and get a good job. However, a baby changes all that. One teen parent, who wanted to remain anonymous, said that, "I could've been a cheerleader. I could've been in pageants and homecoming queen. But I lost all of that." When high school is already so stressful, a baby to take care of is like the equivalent of having doubled the load of homework each night. Going back to my previous point, if a teen parent cannot concentrate on his or her work, then how can his or her have a bright future? The most damaging drawback of being a teen parent is a guilty conscience. God created in all of us a conscience, where we know naturally what is right and wrong. Logically, God says that sex before marriage is wrong. In 2 Timothy 2:22, it says, "Flee the evil desires of youth, and pursue righteousness, faith, love and peace, along with those who call on the Lord out of a pure heart." Therefore, as a teenager, we must flee from the "desires of youth" and pursue with a "pure heart". If we become a teen parent, the guilty conscience of having this baby and disobeying God's law, will stay with you

for the rest of your life. It is like a rain cloud over you heard that never goes away. Therefore, I encourage many teen parents to consider these vast disadvantages before thinking of having sex.

Many people obviously think it is always the teenagers' fault for getting themselves in the debacle of taking care of a child. However, many people forget that most of the time it is because of the parents that many teens are now teen parents. I believe that parents play a huge rule in a child's life, especially during the child's teenage years. Many children react to how their parents act. If their parents constantly shout at them or beat them, then teenagers will feel the need to take drastic measures. Unfortunately in most cases that is teen sex. Sometimes, parents are too busy to get involved in their children's lives. There are some parents that are so involved in work, that children can do whatever they want to do at anytime. One teen parent said that, "My parents never talked to me, that's why I am now a dad." There are some children though who need their parents to get involved in their lives. They will feel depressed and have low self-esteem if their parents are not there for them. That is another reason why teens might have sex. So the question arises then of, "How should good parents act?" Well, I believe that good parents are loving parents who care about their children. According to the national statistics, though, single parenting is the most desired option, with approximately one-third of the pregnant girls nationwide carry their pregnancies to term and keep their babies. The second option is abortion with one-third of the nation carrying out abortions. Adoption comes in last with only about five percent of pregnant girls nationwide putting their babies up for adoption. I can understand the disparity among pregnant mothers because different people value different things. If I am a single parent though, I will elect to become a single parent. Single parenting has a couple disadvantages and advantages. The disadvantages of single parenting are similar to the ones stated earlier such as the drastic change in future, and unable to concentrate on school work. The advantages though are rewarding in a certain viewpoint. First of all, unlike abortion and adoption, you become a person involved in that child's life. A child, obviously, needs to be exposed to the original, biological parents; otherwise, that child will be confused and troubled for the rest of his or her life. Secondly, unlike abortion, you are saving a human being's life. By becoming a single parent, you will not have to stick with the fact that you killed a young child for the rest of your life, for in the Ten Commandments God states that, "Thou shall not murder." Adoption has some disadvantages and advantages as well. If you decide to put your child for adoption, a downside will be that you have no influence in that child's life whatsoever. A good

parent will be involved in his or her child's life as evident of how a parent affects the chances of a teen having sex. Adoption will also make you feel guilty that the boy or girl will grow up thinking questions like, "Why do my parents look different from me?" That child will feel missing piece in his life that he can possibly never recover. An advantage to adoption will be that you will seemingly get a load off your back. You are able to go to school without caring for the baby. In addition, you can almost become a regular teen again; unfortunately, from time to time, you will be thinking about that child somewhere out there in a caring home, who might not know that his or her real parents are not living in the same house as him or her. Finally, let us consider abortion. Now, abortion is a growing practice in the U.S., which is evident since it ties in the national surveys of parenting teens with the legal option of single parenting. However, abortion does not erase the guilt of murdering a living being. Republicans and Democrats constantly debate this widely controversial topic.
